It was an action-packed few days as thousands of industry leaders descended on the capital for London International Shipping Week (LISW25) last month.

While it was the 12th event of its kind, it was the most significant for MNWB as an official charity partner alongside International Maritime Rescue Federation (IMRF), Project Connect and the Sir Thomas Lipton Foundation.

Together, with the charity partners, we held a powerful discussion *Serving a Purpose* – the vital role of maritime charities for the shipping industry, which was attended by over 70 guests at Norton Rose Fulbright.

Each charity was represented on the panel where they discussed the vital role they play in the sector and how they are tackling challenges and issues. The event was hosted by MNWB President Captain Sir Ian McNaught, and there were speeches from Lola Fadina, Director for Maritime at Department for Transport, Captain Kuba

Szymanski, Secretary General at Inter Manager, and Andrew Williams, Partner at Norton Rose Fulbright.

Aside from the event, the MNWB team was in full swing across the week attending over 30 events, including the golf day, headline conference and the flagship gala dinner, meeting both familiar and new faces across the world who were interested in our commitment to seafarer welfare.

This culminated in over £6,000 being raised, which will be shared equally between each charity.

MNWB Annual Awards nominations reopen



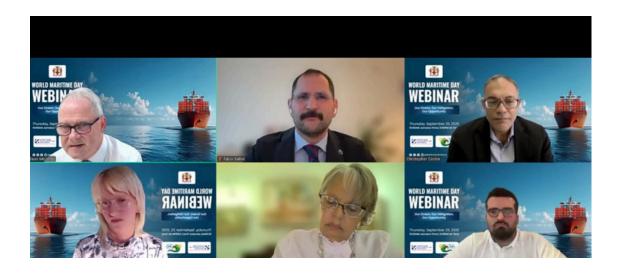
Nominations for MNWB's Annual Awards for Services to Seafarers' Welfare remain open until November 30th.
