

Remembering Peter McEwen



We are deeply saddened to share the news of the passing of Peter McEwen MNM, who died peacefully on Saturday 6th September at the age of 78, surrounded by his family.

Peter was elected an MNWB trustee in 1985, serving as Chair from 1994–2000 and remaining a trustee until 2004, before chairing the Seafarers Hospital Society (SHS) from 2010–2022. A champion of seafarers' welfare and a valued supporter of colleagues, his leadership and contributions will leave a lasting impact on both the MNWB and the SHS.
